The municipality of Liminka offers a variety of educational visits for students and pedagogical staff. The principals and the teachers of basic education and upper secondary school and the staff of early education are experienced in hosting both students and teachers from different countries.

Bilingual education in Finnish and English has been developed in Liminka starting in pre-school education and continuing till the end of upper secondary school. In the English classes the non-Finnish speaking pupils and teachers have a great opportunity to get acquainted with Finnish teaching and the ethos of Finnish education in genuine learning environment.

**Liminka Nature School** offers nature school services for basic education providers in the municipality of Liminka, Finland, and the primary school in particular, as well as for groups of international pupils. The Nature School's services consist of thematic periods lasting from two to four hours, whole school days or longer school camp programmes, all allowing pupils to gain first-hand experience of various aspects of nature and explore the Nordic flora and fauna both outdoors and in.

The Nature School's curriculum follows the cycle of the seasons. In winter, pupils explore snow and its wonders, learn to recognise the tracks of various wild animals, and find out how flora and fauna adjust to the wintry weather. The focus in spring and autumn is on aquatic organisms: pupils will learn to recognise aquatic life and examine invertebrate insects under a microscope. Birdwatching and the life of avifauna are studied all year round. Local forests offer an ideal learning environment to explore the flora, fauna and diversity of nature in the region. A sensory excursion to a swamp provides a diverse range of learning experience in an authentic swamp biotope.







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
